RAMSEY SMITH

Head Coach • Seventh Season at Duke • Duke, 2001

Ramsey Smith enters his seventh season as the Duke men's tennis head coach. He was named the 11th head coach in program history in June, 2008.

Smith, a former Duke men's tennis standout, returned to his alma mater in the 2005-06 season as an assistant coach. He served on the Blue Devils' coaching staff for three seasons as an assistant and associate head coach prior to accepting the head coaching position.

In six seasons at the helm of the Duke program, Smith has compiled an overall record of 128-47 and a 53-12 Atlantic Coast Conference ledger with five straight 20-win seasons. He has taken the Blue Devils to the NCAA Championship in each of his six seasons, winning the first round match each time. Under his watch, Duke has had one ITA National Doubles Team of the Year, one ITA National Rookie of the Year, one ITA National Arthur Ashe Leadership and Sportsmanship Award winner, seven All-America selections, three ITA Regional Seniors of the Year, three ITA Regional Rookies of the Year, two ACC Players of the Year, one ACC Rookie of the Year, 13 All-ACC selections and 24 named to the All-ACC Academic team.

Duke posted a program-record 10 ACC victories in 2014, fueled by a nine-match win streak in conference play that began with a 4-3 upset of No. 9 Notre Dame and also included a win over No. 8 North Carolina in the season finale. Under Smith's direction, the squad finished the year 20-7 and made the program's 23rd consecutive appearance in the NCAA Championship tournament, falling in the second round to Tennessee. Fred Saba and Jason Tahir both represented the Blue Devils in the NCAA Singles Championship, while Saba also eclipsed the 100-win milestone in singles during the spring and closed his collegiate career the program record holder in ACC singles victories with 35 over four seasons. He was joined by Tahir, Raphael Hemmeler and Bruno Semenzato in earning All-ACC recognition.

The Blue Devils finished the 2013 campaign 25-6 to match the 1999, 2000 and 2012 squads for the second most wins in program history. The team completed

the season ranked seventh in the final ITA rankings for the highest final team ranking since the 2006 season. The Blue Devils advanced to the quarterfinals of the NCAA Championship for the eighth time overall and the second consecutive season. Henrique Cunha, Saba and Michael Redlicki competed in the NCAA Singles Championships, while Cunha and Hemmeler as well as Redlicki and Tahir competed in the doubles competition. Cunha and Hemmeler reached the semifinals of the competition to earn All-America honors and concluded the season as the nation's top-ranked duo. The squad completed the regular season second in the ACC standings with a 9-1 ledger and finished with an undefeated 15-0 mark at home for the first time since the 2000-01 campaign. Cunha, Saba and Redlicki were selected to the All-ACC team, with Cunha earning ACC Player of the Year recognition for the second time in his four seasons. Hemmeler paced the squad with 35 singles wins, including a team-leading 25 wins in the dual season. Chris Mengel was named to the All-ACC Academic Team for the third consecutive season as Duke led the conference in representatives on the All-ACC Academic Team. Cunha became the second Blue Devil in program history to win the ITA National Arthur Ashe Leadership and Sportsmanship Award.

In 2011-12, the Blue Devils finished the year 25-6 and completed the season ranked eighth in the final ITA poll. The team advanced to the quarterfinals of the NCAA Championship for the first time since 2001, while Cunha and Mengel also competed in the NCAA Singles and Doubles Championships. Duke concluded ACC play with a 9-2 ledger to finish second in the final regular season standings and reached the championship match of the ACC Championship for the third straight year. Both Cunha and Mengel were selected to the All-ACC team and Saba paced the squad with a 10-1 record in ACC singles play, joining teammates Mengel and Luke Marchese as the only Blue Devils in program history to reach the 10-wins mark.

In 2010-11 Smith led the Blue Devils to a 22-10 overall record, the school's highest win total since 2006. Duke went 9-2 in ACC play to tie for second in the conference and made the ACC Championship finals. Smith also guided his squad

to the Round of 16 in the NCAA Championship and the semifinals of the ITA National Team Indoor Championships. He coached three players to 30-win seasons in singles, marking just the third time it has happened in school history. Both Reid Carleton and Cunha received All-America honors in singles and doubles. The two players advanced to the quarterfinals in the NCAA doubles championships while Cunha also made the quarterfinals in singles and Carleton the Round of 64.

In 2009-10 Smith was named the ITA Carolina Region Coach of the Year after leading Duke to its best season since 2006. The Blue Devils advanced to the NCAA Round of 16 and made the finals of the ACC Championship for the first time since winning the title in 2006. Duke finished the season with a 20-9 record and was second in the ACC with a 9-2 record. Smith coached Cunha to one of the best seasons in school history, as he earned ITA National Rookie of the Year and ACC Player of the Year honors while receiving the No. 1 seed in both singles and doubles at the NCAA Championships. Cunha made the semifinals in singles and teamed with Carleton to earn All-America status by reaching the quarterfinals in doubles. The duo was named the ITA National Doubles Team of the Year after ranking No. 1 in each of the final five polls.

In his first season as the Blue Devils' head coach, Smith guided Duke to a 16-9 record and 7-4 mark in the ACC. The first-year head coach turned things around for the program, posting a .640 winning percentage after the team went 11-14 (.440) in 2007-08, its first losing season since 1970. The Blue Devils advanced to the second round of the NCAA Championship tournament and finished the year ranked No. 23 nationally. Kiril Dimitrov was named to the All-ACC squad.

Smith has excelled on the recruiting front in his six seasons. His first year he brought in Cunha, who earned National Rookie of the Year honors. The second class under Smith was the No. 1 rated recruiting class in 2010-11 according to Tennisrecruiting.net. The three players in the class combined to win 62 singles matches as freshmen, led by Mengel who went 33-11 and earned ITA Regional Rookie of the Year honors. In the third signing class, Smith picked up his second international recruit with Hemmeler coming from Switzerland and also signed blue chip recruit Tahir, a top-10 player from New York. The two combined for 52 wins in singles as freshmen and Hemmeler won a team-high 30 matches in doubles. In his fourth class, Smith brought in the third ranked recruiting class according to *Tennisrecruiting.net*. He signed his third international recruit with Semenzato of Brazil in 2012 and his fourth with Nicolas Alvarez of Peru arriving in the fall of 2014.

During his three seasons as an assistant coach, Smith helped lead Duke to a 49-31 overall record and 23-10 mark in the ACC. Under his tutelage the Blue Devils produced five All-Americans, eight All-ACC selections and one ACC Championship MVP in just three seasons. Duke made the NCAA Championship tournament

each year, advancing as far as the Round of 16 in 2006. That season the Blue Devils also captured the ACC Championship with a 4-3 win in the finals over Virginia after trailing 3-0 in the match.

Also while an assistant coach at Duke, Smith started the Royal Blue Club, a Duke tennis fan club that gives special promotions for men's and women's matches. Smith has also helped the Blue Devils raise money for new indoor and outdoor courts and scoreboards as well as a new video system with cameras on all six indoor and outdoor courts.

A native of Hilton Head, S.C., Smith lettered four seasons at Duke from 1998-2001 and ranks third all-time in school history with 118 career singles victories. He helped the Blue Devils to four-year records of 96-11 overall and an undefeated 32-0 mark in conference regular season action. From 1998-2001 Duke claimed four ACC Championships, four top 10 national rankings and three NCAA Championship quarterfinal appearances. Smith finished his career with a 119-37 singles record and 103-47 doubles ledger. A staple in the ITA singles and doubles rankings, Smith was ranked as high as No. 5 in singles in 2001 and No. 5 in doubles in 2000 with Doug Root. He was ranked in the top-10 in singles for four consecutive rankings during his senior season.

Smith was a two-time All-America earning the honor in 2000 and 2001. He was named All-ACC three times in 1999, 2000 and 2001. Smith was named the ACC Tournament MVP in the 2000 and 2001 ACC Championship victories. In addition, he was a two-time recipient of the Tennis Magazine/Arthur Ashe Sportsmanship Award and was named to the ACC's 50th Anniversary Team in 2002.

After receiving his bachelor of arts degree in economics from Duke in 2001, Smith played one year of professional tennis. He posted an ATP world ranking of 603 in singles and 723 in doubles before suffering a career-ending shoulder injury in September of 2002. He reached the semifinals at Futures Tournaments in Malibu, Calif.; Chetumal, Mexico; and Little Rock, Ark.

Following his professional career, Smith worked with the Smith Stearns Tennis Academy, where he served as a coach, camp organizer and academy secretary for three years. He also spent three summers (2003-05) as a full-time fly fishing guide with Alaska West Sportfishing.

Smith completed the USTA High Performance Coaching Program in Carson, Calif., in 2007 and is a USPTA certified Teaching Professional.

Born September 4, 1978, Ramsey and his wife, Kathy, reside in Durham with their daughter, Sofie.

JONATHAN STOKKE

Assistant Coach • Fifth Season at Duke • Duke, 2006

Jonathan Stokke enters his fifth season as an assistant coach at Duke University. He was named to his position with the men's tennis team in July, 2010.

Stokke's fourth season with the Blue Devils saw the team record a program-record 10 ACC victories, fueled by a nine-match win streak during the spring. Duke concluded 2014 with a 20-7 record and hosted an NCAA Regional for the 13th time in school history, advancing to the second round of the NCAA Championship tournament. Under his watch, four Blue Devils earned spots on the All-ACC teams.

In 2012-13, Stokke helped guide the Blue Devils to a 25-6 record to match the 1999, 2000 and 2012 squads for the second most wins in program history. The program also reached the quarterfinals of the NCAA Championship tournament for the eighth time in school history and earned a No. 7 listing in the final ITA rankings for the highest final team ranking since the 2006 season. The team completed its home schedule with a 15-0 record, marking the first undefeated regular season for the squad since the 2000-01 campaign. Stokke became the second coach under head coach Ramsey Smith to be named the ITA Carolina Region Assistant Coach of the Year and the third in the program's history.

During the 2011-12 campaign, Stokke helped direct the Blue Devils to a 25-6 record and the quarterfinals of the NCAA Championship tournament while earning a No. 8 listing in the final ITA rankings. The team also reached the ACC Championship finals for the third consecutive season, the second under the guidance of Stokke.

In his first season with the Blue Devils, Stokke helped guide the team to a 22-10 overall record and 9-2 mark in ACC play. The season was highlighted by a trip to the semifinals of the ITA National Team Indoor Championships, a Round of 16 appearance in the NCAA Championship tournament and a trip to the ACC Championship finals. Stokke led Duke to an impressive year in doubles with Reid Carleton and Henrique Cunha posting a 38-7 record and advancing to the quarterfinals of the NCAA Individual Championships to earn All-America honors.

Stokke joined the coaching staff of his alma mater after working as an assistant women's tennis coach at Wake Forest University for two years. Stokke directed the Demon Deacons to a 24-27 overall record and an NCAA Championship tournament selection in 2009. He saw two players earn spots on the 2010 All-ACC team, including Martina Pavelec, who also received the ITA Carolina Region Player to Watch award.

Prior to working at Wake Forest, Stokke spent two years providing instruction to highly ranked junior players under the guidance of Stan Smith and Billy Stearns at Smith Stearns Tennis Academy in Hilton Head, S.C.

Stokke graduated from Duke in May, 2006, with a degree in sociology and a certificate in markets and management. In 2006, he earned All-America honors in doubles with teammate Joey Atas. He was a two-time All-ACC selection in 2003 and 2004 and was named the ACC Championship MVP in 2006. He also is the first player in program history to win the ITA National Arthur Ashe Leadership and Sportsmanship Award, claiming the honor in 2006. He also earned the USTA Sportsmanship Award that season, joining Ramsey Smith as the only other player in program history to do so. Stokke also picked up numerous academic honors, including a selection to the first ever All-ACC Academic Team and three seasons on the ACC Honor Roll.

In his career at Duke, Stokke played in four straight NCAA Championship tournaments and advanced to the NCAA Round of 16 three times. In 2006 he was a team captain on Duke's ACC championship team. For his career Stokke had a 93-59 overall singles record and a 113-47 doubles mark. His 113 doubles victories rank him fourth on the all-time Duke list. He was 25-10 in singles and 28-9 in doubles in ACC matches. His 28 doubles wins place him second on the Duke career chart. He was ranked in the top 20 in the ITA in singles and top 10 in doubles during his playing career with the Blue Devils.

During his junior tennis career, Stokke won three national hard court doubles championships at Kalamazoo and three national clay court doubles championships. He also played in the U.S. Open main draw in 2001 and 2002 and was a member of the 2000 USTA Youth World Cup team. He was awarded the USTA Sportsmanship award at Kalamazoo two times. A graduate of East Chapel Hill High School, Stokke was the recipient of two sportsmanship awards at the Super National Championships and was ranked as high as No. 10 on the 2002 USTA Juniors list.

Born April 11, 1984, Stokke resides in Durham.

► **2014-15:** One of only 32 players to qualify for the USTA/ITA National Indoor Championship, but was forced to withdraw due to illness ... Led the Blue Devils with a 14-3 overall record in the fall, including a 4-2 mark versus nationally ranked opponents ... Ended the fall campaign winning eight of his final 10 matches ... Played way into the semifinals of the USTA/ITA Carolina Regional with five consecutive victories, including three in straight sets ... Avenged an earlier loss to North Carolina State's Austin Powell with a 6-3, 6-4 victory to reach to quarterfinals of the event ... Came back to down North Carolina's Ronnie Schneider, ranked No. 23 in the ITA preseason poll, 6-7 (6), 6-1, 6-4 to move to the semifinals ... At the ITA All-American Championship, advanced to the quarterfinals to earn the USTA/ITA National Indoor Championship bid ... Became the first Blue Devil to advance to the quarters of the ITA All-American Championship since current head coach Ramsey Smith and Marko Cerenko in 2000 ... Won three consecutive matches during the qualifying stage of the ITA All-American to earn a trip to the main draw, where he advanced to the quarterfinals ... Within the main draw, defeated consecutive top-20 opponents to earn a trip to the quarterfinals ... Lost the first set to Illinois' Jared Hiltzik, ranked No. 6 in the preseason ITA poll, in the round of 32 before coming back to take the next two sets 7-5 and 6-4 ... Won the deciding third set against USF's Roberto Cid, the No. 19 player in the ITA's preseason poll, 6-4 to advance to the quarterfinals ... Started the fall 3-1 at the Duke Fab Four Invite ... Entered the fall season ranked by the ITA as the No. 8 newcomer/freshman ... In doubles, played with Bruno Semenzato and Raphael Hemmeler, going 2-1 with Semenzato and 4-1 with Hemmeler ... Paired with Hemmeler for the USTA/ITA Carolina Regional and advanced to the semifinals before falling to eventual champions Ian Dempster and Robbie Mudge of N.C. State ... Played all three matches with Semenzato at the Duke Fab Four.

► **PRIOR TO DUKE:** Owned Association of Tennis Professionals (ATP) world rankings in singles and doubles and had a career high ranking of No. 111 by the Juniors International Tennis Federation (ITF) ... Participated in two matches at the US Open Junior Tennis Championship in early September of 2014 ... Immediately before beginning freshman fall semester at Duke, took part in the Youth Olympic Games (YOG) in Nanjing, China ... Lost singles match at the YOG, but earned a doubles win in the main draw Round of 16 to advance to the quarterfinals ... During the summer of 2014, took part in The Junior Championships, Wimbledon and lost in the singles main draw ... Earned a doubles win to move to the main draw Round of 16 before bowing out ... During June of 2014 played in the Nike Junior International Roehampton and the Roland Garros Junior French Championships ... During those two events, won one doubles match in the Junior French main draw to advance to the Round of 16 ... Lost in the finals of the Ecuador Grade 1 ITF tournament in Guayaquil, Ecuador, before winning the Inka Bowl in Lima, Peru, in early February of 2014 ... Won the Copa Gatorade 2014 event in Caracas, Venezuela, in January of 2014 with five consecutive victories ... Won the Peru Junior Open and the Seventh Paraguay Junior Open while reaching the finals of three other ITF circuit tournaments ... 2013-14 SEASON IN REVIEW

BLUE DEVILS END SEASON IN TOP 15:

► Duke finished the season standing 14th in the final Intercollegiate Tennis Association (ITA) rankings. It marked the fifth consecutive campaign the Blue Devils have ended the year standing among the top 15 teams in the country.

INDIVIDUAL RANKINGS:

► Duke ended the campaign with a trio of players listed in the final ITA rankings. Leading the way was Jason Tahir, who stood No. 41. He began the season ranked No. 111 before rocketing up the charts. He tallied nine wins over ranked opponents during the campaign and earned a career-best ranking of No. 30 in late April. Fred Saba checked in No. 49 after going 12-5 in the No. 2 spot in Duke's lineup. Bruno Semenzato made his first appearance in the final rankings by checking in No. 94. He went 9-2 against ACC competition during the year. In doubles, Saba and Raphael Hemmeler were tabbed at No. 50 after teaming up for a 14-7 mark.

DUKE MAKES 24TH NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP APPEARANCE:

► Duke was selected to the NCAA Team Championship field for the 23rd consecutive season and the 24th time overall, receiving the No. 11 overall seed in the tournament. Head coach Ramsey Smith's squad was selected to host an NCAA Regional for the fifth straight season, and defeated Winthrop before falling to Tennessee in the second round.

TWO EARN BIDS TO SINGLES CHAMPIONSHIP:

► Saba and Tahir represented Duke at the 2014 NCAA Singles Championship after receiving at-large bids into the field. Saba went to the event for the

second straight year while Tahir earned his first selection. Duke has had at least one player selected to compete in the NCAA Individual Championships for five consecutive seasons.

FOUR ALL-ACC SELECTIONS FOR DUKE:

► The Blue Devils placed four members of its 2015 squad on All-ACC Teams. Tahir and Saba were first-team honorees while Hemmeler and Semenzato received third-team recognition. Duke's four honorees were the second most in the league, behind five from regular-season champion Virginia. Saba was named to an All-ACC team for the second consecutive year and the other three received their first career accolades.

HEMMELEER RECEIVES ARTHUR ASHE LEADERSHIP AND SPORTSMANSHIP AWARD:

► Hemmeler became the fourth Blue Devil to receive the ITA Carolina Region Arthur Ashe Leadership and Sportsmanship Award, joining current head coach Ramsey Smith (2000 and 2001), current assistant coach Jonathan Stokke (2006) and Henrique Cunha (2013). The award is given annually to a player in each region who who exhibits outstanding sportsmanship and leadership as well as scholastic, extracurricular and tennis achievements.

DUKE TOTALS 20 WINS:

► The Blue Devils reached the 20-win plateau for the fifth consecutive season. Prior to the current stretch, Duke had not reached the 20-win mark since the spring of 2006.

BLUE DEVILS WIN 10 ACC MATCHES:

► Duke ended the league campaign with a 10-1 mark in regular season action. The 10 wins were the most in ACC play and marked the fifth consecutive campaign the Blue Devils had tallied nine or more league victories. The 10 wins surpassed the nine-win mark set by the 2006, 2010, 2011, 2012 and 2013 squads. The Blue Devils finished second in the ACC regular season standings, dropping a 5-1 decision to Virginia.

SABA REACHED 100 CAREER WINS:

► Saba wrapped up his senior campaign with a final singles record of 21-10 and a four-year ledger of 103-50. He is tied for eighth in career singles victories and is one of just 12 players to surpass the 100-win milestone for his career. The Fort Lauderdale, Fla., native also compiled a career record of 89-52 in doubles while earning two selections to the All-ACC teams.

A TRIO NAMED TO ALL-ACC ACADEMIC TEAM:

► In addition to the All-ACC accolades, Hemmeler, Tahir and Semenzato were also named to the All-ACC Academic Team. Duke has had at least three student-athletes on the All-ACC Academic Team in each of the past nine seasons and 38 overall since the award's inception in 2006. The honor was the third of Hemmeler's career and the second for Tahir.

FIVE RECEIVE ITA SCHOLAR-ATHLETE AWARDS:

► Duke was honored by the ITA for compiling a cumulative grade point average of 3.20 or above. Not only a team award, the ITA also named Hemmeler, Tahir, Josh Levine, Daniel McCall TJ Pura All-Academic Scholar-Athletes.

- Duke compiled an overall record of 20-7 and went 10-1 in ACC play with the 10 conference victories marking a program record.
- The Blue Devils made their 23rd consecutive appearance in the NCAA Team Championship and hosted an NCAA Regional for the 13th time in program history. The squad advanced to the second round before falling to No. 20 Tennessee.
- Duke had two representatives in the NCAA Singles Championship, with senior Fred Saba making his second consecutive appearance in the tournament. Saba and junior Jason Tahir both reached the second round of the singles draw.
- Saba closed his career at Duke as the all-time record holder in ACC singles victories with 35 over his four seasons. In a team victory over Georgia Tech Apr. 13, he became the 12th player in program history to reach the 100-win milestone in singles. The Fort Lauderdale, Fla., native totaled career ledgers of 103-50 in singles and 89-52 in doubles.
- Duke posted a nine-match win streak that began with a 4-3 upset of No. 9 Notre Dame and also included a victory over No. 8 North Carolina in the season finale. The streak continued through the quarterfinals of the ACC Championship with a 4-3 decision over Virginia Tech.

ACC CHAMPIONSHIPS

1982

Led by Duke Sports Hall of Fame member Marc Flur, the 1982 Blue Devils accomplished feats above and beyond what any previous program had seen. Duke set a school record with 31 wins en route to a 31-4 season. The Blue Devils cruised through ACC competition undefeated at 7-0 to claim the program's first ACC Championship. Chiam Arlosorov was the first Blue Devil to receive the ACC Tournament MVP Award.

1991

In just his first season as the head coach at Duke University, Jay Lapidus set the tone for his coaching career by leading the Blue Devils to a 19-6 record and the ACC Championship. After a narrow 5-4 victory over Wake Forest in the first round of the ACC Tournament, Duke cruised to a 5-1 win against Clemson in the semifinals and 5-2 victory over North Carolina in the finals. Jason Rubell was chosen as the ACC Tournament MVP.

1993

The 1993 team posted a record of 24-5 on the year and became just the second Duke squad to go through ACC play undefeated, recording an 8-0 ledger. The Blue Devils defeated Virginia, 5-2, Wake Forest, 6-1, and downed North Carolina in the championship match, 5-1. Willy Quest was tabbed ACC Tournament MVP.

1994

For the second straight season, Duke finished with a perfect record in the ACC, posting a 7-0 mark. The squad cruised to a 7-0 victory over NC State, easily defeated Clemson, 6-1, and came away with a 4-1 win in the ACC Championship match against Georgia Tech. Chris Pressley was awarded ACC Tournament MVP.

1995

Jay Lapidus earned his third ACC Coach of the Year award and first ITA Region II Coach of the Year honor in 1995 after coaching Duke to a 7-1 regular season record in the ACC and third consecutive ACC Championship. In the conference tournament, the Blue Devils opened with a 7-0 win against NC State, then edged North Carolina, 4-3, in the semifinals and pulled away from Clemson with a 5-1 victory in the finals. The ACC Tournament MVP was awarded to Phillippe Moggio.

1996

The Blue Devils won their fourth straight ACC Championship in 1996 with a 4-1 victory over North Carolina. They advanced to the finals with wins over Georgia Tech and Florida State. Rob Chess earned ACC Tournament MVP honors.

1998

After a year-long absence from the ACC Championship circle, Duke climbed right back in with a 4-2 victory over Virginia in 1998. The team posted its second straight undefeated conference record at 8-0. In the ACC Tournament, the Blue Devils downed NC State and Florida State before defeating Virginia in the finals. Dmitry Muzyka was tabbed ACC Tournament MVP.

1999

Jay Lapidus earned his second ITA Region II Coach of the Year award in 1999 after guiding Duke to its seventh ACC Championship in nine years. The Blue Devils started with a 4-1 win against NC State in the ACC Tournament and followed with 4-0 victories over Virginia and Georgia Tech to win the title. Pedro Escudero was named ACC Tournament MVP.

2000

Duke continued its dominance in 2000, winning the ACC Championship for the third straight year and finishing the ACC season 8-0. The Blue Devils swept NC State, 5-0, defeated Virginia, 6-1, and downed North Carolina, 4-1, to take the conference title. Ramsey Smith added to his ACC Tournament MVP with the USTA Sportsmanship Award and ITA Region II Arthur Ashe Sportsmanship and Leadership Award.

2001

The 2001 squad continued Duke's dominance on the tennis courts with its fourth consecutive ACC Championship. The Blue Devils cruised through the regular season with an 8-0 conference record and continued to roll through the tournament. They defeated Maryland, 5-0, in the first round and advanced to the championship with a 4-1 victory over Wake Forest. They went on to sweep Clemson, 4-0, for the title. Ramsey Smith was named ACC Tournament MVP for the second straight year.

2003

In 2003, the Blue Devils finished with an 8-0 ACC record for the seventh straight season, extending the streak of 58 consecutive conference victories that would end in 2004. Duke swept Maryland and Wake Forest to begin the ACC Tournament and capped off the title run with a 4-1 victory against Clemson. Michael Yani was named ACC Tournament MVP.

2006

Duke won the 2006 ACC Championship in dramatic fashion. After losing the doubles point and two singles matches versus No. 9 Virginia, the Blue Devils trailed, 3-0. However, they stormed back to win three straight singles matches and Stephen Amritraj clinched the title with a three-set win at the No. 6 position. The Blue Devils defeated Virginia Tech, 4-1, and Florida State, 4-2, to advance to the finals. Jonathan Stokke was named ACC Tournament MVP.

Duke Sports Hall of Fame

Marc Flur stands as one of the winningest tennis players in Duke history with a career record of 110-29. He is also the first Duke tennis player to be inducted into the Hall of Fame. He earned ITA All-America honors in 1983 and finished his senior season ranked No. 15 in the nation in singles. The 1983 ACC Tournament MVP, Flur is the only player in Duke history to earn five league flight championships, capturing two singles titles and three doubles crowns.

Flur also helped propel Duke to its first ever ACC Team Championship in 1982. The 1982 team also established a school record for wins in a season, compiling a 31-4 mark, and made the program's first appearance in the NCAA Championship.

Following his college career, Flur went on to play on the professional tennis tour for six years. His highest ranking was No. 71 in the world in singles and No. 60 in doubles. He played at Wimbledon five times and in the U.S. Open on six occasions.

Flur returned to Duke in 1989 to serve as an assistant coach for the men's tennis team. He worked for one season under former coach Steve Strome and two years with Jay Lapidus. During Flur's tenure, the Blue Devil teams compiled a 52-30 record and won one ACC championship.

Flur, who was inducted into the Duke Athletics Hall of Fame in 1995, now works as a Certified Financial Planner with The Piedmont Carolinas Group, LLC., in Durham.
